



English for Families

AFTER TRYING FOR TWO YEARS to get English for Families off the ground, the 12 week program began at the Lucketts Elementary School last fall. A second session of classes started in January.

Classes meet two nights a week for two hours each night with parents working on their English skills through reading, writing, listening, and speaking. The lessons for parents focus on skills they can use to more actively participate in their children's education and on general life skills, such as communicating at work or with the doctor.

While the parents are busy learning their skills, the children are also engaged in fun learning activities that are designed to boost their language, academic, and social skills.

Then both parents and children get together at the end of the evening to participate in a joint literacy activity that is designed to strengthen the bond between parents and children, reinforce literacy skills, and teach educational activities and games that can be used at home.

The goals of the program are:

- Help parents and children reach their language and learning goals together.
- Empower parents to be directly and actively involved in their children's development and education.
- Strengthen the bond between parents and their children through literacy activities.
- Reinforce the parents' role as their child's first teacher.
- Create a sense of community among the participants, to help parents develop their own network of support and encourage attendance.

The program served 27 adults in the Fall term. This included parents, grandparents, aunts, and uncles of students at the Lucketts Elementary School, and a few other Lucketts residents. Most of the participants are Hispanic with one Ukranian family also participating. There are six adults on the waiting list. There are 23 children also in the program with about half in grades 1 through 5 and the other half preschoolers and kindergarteners.

Everyone is very excited about the program and the adults are eager to learn. This program is unique in the county, in that it removes some of the barriers to learning by involving the entire family and the community in the program. Many




of the participants can walk to the school. Volunteers are also assisting with helping the adults work on their skills individually or with the children. This program accommodates students at a variety of levels and provides a quality educational experience for children rather than just child care while the parents are learning.

The parents pay a \$20 registration fee and receive an Oxford Picture Dictionary and a binder to organize their materials.

The first year's funding is being provided by the Lucketts Community Center Advisory Board. Additional support has been provided by Shoppers Food Warehouse, Target, and Walmart in the form of \$25 gift cards for supplies.

Additional community support is welcome. Additional volunteers are needed to help with the program, including helping with the children, helping the parents with their individual goals, and providing clerical assistance. Funding for 2007-2008 is also needed. Please contact Lauren Lang at 703-777-4462 to volunteer. 🐾

Lucketts Community Center Advisory Board volunteers advise and support the Loudoun County Department of Parks, Recreation and Community Services. We are a 501(C)3 organization that raises money and then channels it back into our community through programs and charitable donations.

The LCCAB is best known for sponsoring the Lucketts Fair and the Lucketts Bluegrass Series – programs that have welcomed visitors to our village for more than 30 years to celebrate the rural traditions of our community.

The Fair is the primary source of revenue for the LCCAB and for other community organizations such as the PTA and local churches that serve as vendors at the Fair. Hosting this event is a huge and rewarding undertaking. Determining how we reinvest its proceeds is equally rewarding.

- Funds raised by the LCCAB have been used over the years to restore and maintain the Old Lucketts School building (e.g. building and electrical upgrades, stage renovation) and to purchase land for the community park which offers ball fields and a bike/running path. Currently, the Advisory Board is working to upgrade the Community Center kitchen to meet commercial codes so it can be used by local groups for special events.
- LCCAB funds preschool, daycare and camp scholarships, striving to make early educational programs at the community center accessible to every family in our community.
- LCCAB supports programs and organizations that benefit our community. In 2006 and 2007, LCCAB provided more than \$10,000 to establish an English for Families program. LCCAB makes financial contributions to organizations such as the Lucketts Elementary School PTA, The Lucketts Volunteer Fire Department and the Loudoun Abused Women's Shelter. 🐾

Annual Scholarship Awards Winners Announced for 2006


A TOTAL OF FOUR local residents attending college or post high school vocational school are recipients of this year's Lucketts Ruritan Club scholarships. Seven thousand dollars has been distributed by the Club for 2006. The recent graduates receiving scholarship awards are: **Sumeet Lall**, *Virginia Commonwealth University*, **Kathryn Brown**, *University of Mary Washington*; **Jon Mike Richards**, *Messiah College*, and **Alexandra Hambrick**, *James Madison University*.



Club Scholarship Committee chairman Gary Franklin encourages Lucketts high school seniors to seriously consider applying for next year. Qualifications consist of simply residing within the Lucketts area and being enrolled as a senior in either high school or a vocational institute. For example, applications are traditionally solicited from Loudoun County High as well as CS Monroe Technology Center, Thomas Jefferson High School and Notre Dame Academy.

Franklin confirms that the amount of the Lucketts Ruritan Club's scholarship is significant when compared to the amounts other local awards. Typically three \$1,500 scholarships are awarded to high school seniors. Additionally,

three repeat scholarships totaling \$2,500 are available to last year's winners. In 2006, no applications for repeat scholarships were received, so the \$7,000 scholarship fund was allocated to the four individuals identified above.



Each year applications received by the Scholarship Committee are forwarded to the Point of Rocks Ruritan Club for an impartial review. Scholarship awards are determined by an applicant's personal achievements. Both academic performance and community service are each weighted equally at 50% in an evaluation. Letters of recommendation are also accepted. Scholarship winners consistently distinguish themselves as students who excel in the classroom and who demonstrate a strong, long-term commitment to the Lucketts community.

The Scholarship Committee currently consists of chairman Gary Franklin, Norbert Dee and Jeff Judge. Applications may be obtained through your school's guidance office or by calling Gary at 703 771-1490. 
