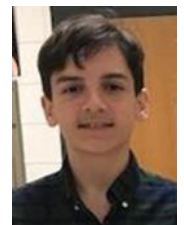

Grace Maloney is a junior at Freedom High School in South Riding, and she attended the Academy of Engineering and Technology for two years. As part of a team, Grace developed a biodegradable planter pot made of biosolids that has won various awards and been developed into business called Grow Greenly. She is president of her school's Environmental Club and a co-inventor and patent holder for the "Floodie" life vest.



Bryce Hilliard is an eighth grader at Farmwell Station Middle School in Ashburn. While participating in the Tomatosphere program, Bryce learned about plant research on the International Space Station and grew tomatoes from space-flown seeds. This work motivated him to establish Space Dreamers, a nonprofit dedicated to expanding local students' access to space science education.
