

One trash and two recycling containers are available during Trash and Recycling Collection at Lucketts Elementary School each Saturday. Due to increased home deliveries, our two containers fill up very quickly each week. Please make sure you **ONLY** recycle the following items. All boxes need to be flattened, and nothing should be put in plastic garbage bags.

Acceptable Materials

- Bottles, Cans, Jugs, and Jars
- Aluminum cans
- Steel cans
- Plastic bottles (lid may stay on)
- Plastic jugs (lid may stay on)
- Plastic jars (lid may stay on)
- Glass bottles and jars (leave lid off)
- Paper:
- Cardboard (flattened)
- Catalogs
- Cereal boxes, snack boxes, tissue boxes, etc.
- Greeting cards
- Hard cover books (remove and discard cover)
- Junk mail, envelopes
- Magazines
- Maps
- Newspapers
- Office paper
- Paperback books
- Phonebooks
- Site plans
- No shredded paper

If it is not a bottle, can, jug, jar, paper, or cardboard, then it is not accepted at the recycling center, no exceptions. If in doubt, leave it out. Please don't assume something is accepted at the recycling center just because it is plastic, metal, glass, paper or has the "recycling symbol" on it. The following list of unaccepted items may also help for further clarification:

The following items ARE NOT ACCEPTABLE for recycling and should be disposed with trash,

- Air filters
- Animal feed bags
- Antifreeze bottles
- Batteries
- Beverage glasses
- Buckets

Plastic bags (trash bags, recycling bags, clear bags, blue bags, grocery bags...no plastic bags)
Plastic containers other than the shape of a bottle, jug, or jar
Plate glass
Plexiglass
Porcelain
Pottery
Rope
Scrap metal
Screws, bolts, nails, etc.
Shredded paper
Screens
Spiral bound notebooks (remove and discard binding, recycle the paper)
String
Styrofoam
Syringes, medication applicators, needles, etc.
Three ringed binders, plastic binders
