The Lucketts Ruritan Club has awarded scholarships to deserving Lucketts area high school seniors since 1989. Scholarships are presented to students who demonstrate scholastic excellence and possess a sense of community and charity given in memory of our departed members.



Instructions

Applicant: Please read these instructions carefully and complete all portions of the application. It is due by *March 15*. Incomplete or late applications will not be considered. Your application will be reviewed and ranked by Ruritan members who reside outside of the Lucketts area. This will remove any bias in the ranking. Scholarship winners and award amounts will be announced at the school awards assembly. Funds will be sent directly to the student account at the school as soon as the student's account is established.

Eligibility: You must reside in the Lucketts area which is defined as: "That part of Loudoun County bounded by Tutt Lane on the South, the Potomac River on the North and East and by the Catoctin Ridge on the West." In addition, you must be enrolled as a senior in a certified home school or certified high school program and you must graduate in the year of selection to receive an award.

Schools eligible to attend: Community Colleges.



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Letters of Recommendation

Two letters of recommendation should be provided, with one of the letters from a non-parent teacher or minister, employer, or community service leader. Neither letter may be from a family member. Letters should be submitted via email to *ruritan.scholarship@gmail.com*, with your name in the subject line. Please provide the following information to the persons providing a recommendation. A Home School candidate, applying for a Lucketts Ruritan Club Memorial Scholarship Award, has identified you as a reference and asks for you to prepare a Letter of Recommendation attesting to their merit. Scholarships are presented to students who demonstrate scholastic excellence and possess a sense of community and charity—given in memory of our departed members.

It would be most helpful if you could relate specific circumstances/events in which the candidate's actions and or responses reflect certain traits or characteristics. Please address the following questions in your letter:

- 1. Does the candidate have leadership potential?
- 2. Does the candidate set a good example as a positive role model for others?
- 3. Does the candidate make plans to attain goals, and does the candidate follow-through with necessary actions?
- 4. Please submit your letter directly to the Lucketts Ruritan Club via email attachment to: *ruritan.scholarship@gmail.com*. The student's name should appear in the subject line.
- 5. Letters are due not later than March 15th.



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Transcript

Submit: one or more of the following to: <u>*ruritan.scholarship@gmail.com*</u>, with your name in the subject line.

- **a.** If you have a transcript from a public or private school, please provide a copy.
- **b.** If you have been awarded a GED, please provide a copy.
- **C.** If you do not have a transcript from a public or private school that covers your junior and at least the first semester of your senior year, please provide the following:
 - 1. A brief (2-3 pages) description of the last two years of your home school studies and an assessment of your knowledge in each subject area studied. Your parents or the person(s) responsible for overseeing your schooling should prepare this "transcript". If you have provided a similar document to a college or university admissions office, a copy of that will be acceptable.
 - **2.** Copies of any course completion certificates, including grades, for courses taken at or above the high school junior level.

Financial Need

Submit: Page one of your FSS (FAFSA Submission Summary) which includes the SAI (Student Aid Index). The FSS is the report you receive after submitting your FAFSA (Free Application for Financial Student Aid) to the U.S. Department of Education. The FAFSA is on-line at FAFSA.gov. While we prefer the FSS report, if you do not have a FSS report, provide a seperate statement of the financial challenges you face in pursuing your post high school education.
